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

While I know several people who would have passed out at the thought of having to share their birthday, I for one am thankful. Not only does a joint birthday give me a reason to be a kid again, but it also allows me to give double praise to God for His goodness and His mercy.

Let me explain.

I remember hearing my doctor walk through each step of the C-Section for the student interns in the room (and for my own curiosity). I remember the pressure and then a release as our son entered the world and the pride I could see in my husband's face and the awe of life in his eyes. I remember our doctor saying that he was a beautiful baby boy. Next, I heard the nurse count fingers and toes and as she suctioned his nose, I heard a slight cry ... and then silence.

Silence that was exaggerated by the fact that I could not sit up and I could not see beyond the curtain at my waist. My ears sharpened and I focused on discerning the room. Silence was all I felt or heard. I waited listening specifically for his cry. Babies cry when they are born. Where is his cry? Why the silence.

Then, there was a peace that hit my spirit and it was that peace that scared me. As I asked if everything was ok, the side door flew open. The side door that they had previously informed me led to the NICU. The nurse moved with a calm but deliberate pace towards the door holding my son like a football. As she walked swiftly towards the door, I called after her to ask if he was ok and if I could please at least see his face so that I would at know which baby was mine. She froze in her tracks, and I could see the moment she was processing my request, should she turn or keep walking?

I silently plead with God for his life and for a moment. A moment to see his face so I would know which baby was mine. Even as I write that statement alone still brings me to tears.

When the nurse turned, I could see that my son's little perfect face was a hue of blue. I told her thank you, bless you, now go!

Peace immediately rested on me as I helplessly lay on the table being stitched back together.

My husband's presence and his countenance gave me reassurance. He smoothed my hair and rested his lips on my forehead. It was a silent moment of reckoning as we prepared for the spiritual fight for our son's life. I knew that there was no room for doubt, worry or fear. The faith fight that brought us to this point of labor and delivery was not over. We now had a fight to survive and a fight to thrive.

I knew the promise God made me. So, I thanked God for preserving my life through the birthing process. I thanked God for my oldest daughter, my husband, and my son. We were all allowed to go into the NICU to see him and we entered with peace, not fear. This was a miracle baby with the DNA of FAITH running through his veins. We recognized the spiritual fight and knowing we already had the victory; my husband spoke specific instructions to our son. You will live and not die. You are more than a conqueror and we declare it with a joyful heart of Thanksgiving.

After things settled down, we were sent to a room for my recovery. My daughter said she needed to go with Mema but would be right back.

About an hour later, she came back with a birthday cake and some food. They sang happy birthday to me, and she kissed my cheek and said, "Mommy, I didn't want you to think that we forgot your birthday." I remember the hug that we shared and the strength that passed back and forth in that embrace.

In that moment, I remember the overwhelming feeling of being THANKFUL.

Thankful that all is, would and shall be well... and thankful for that cake. Let me tell you, it was the best cake I have ever had!

Thankful that my son was passing every milestone and test required to be released from the hospital.

Being grateful is a powerful emotion. It has the power to give you strength to endure.

Fast forward, my son is now a thriving, curious, determined little boy who loves to run and play with his Legos. (He calls himself a Master Builder.) He has stolen the hearts of all whom he encounters with his curly hair, dimples, and charming personality. He is an old soul and reminds me of his father and both of his grandfathers. When I see him with my dad, I am thankful for the legacy that is being imparted every day. When I watch my husband William Jr in the backyard with our son, William III, I know that William Sr is smiling in heaven saying, "That's my boy."

This year, we will continue our birthday tradition with a shared tiered cake. We will have a Spiderman on one side and red roses on the other for me.

Now, that is something to be thankful for!



What is it that you have in these times?


- 1. You have joy. The joy of the Lord is your strength.



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
This directly coincides with the Apostle Paul's statement 'And we know that All things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose.'

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
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## THE CALL TO COUNSEL: THE MINISTRY OF RECONCILIATION

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No one is exempt from suffering regardless of their religious beliefs. Comforting individuals who embrace false doctrines does not suggest that we accept their doctrine. If you are one of those people who believe that perhaps there is some good in every religion, I tell you that all religions can be a lie but only one can be the truth. Doctrines of demons cannot be accommodated. We can respect the humanity in God's creation while abhorring the disease of ignorance which is detrimental to the soul. Christians who counsel need to be thoroughly convinced that there is no room in the Kingdom of God for doctrines of devils, nor is there room in the mind of Christians to accommodate seducing spirits that tickle the ears.

We know the truth because the Spirit that abides within teaches the believer. Science has only validated what we already know. Masoretic scribes were responsible for reproducing the original text of the Hebrew Bible. Their work dated back to the end of the 5th century. The verses, the words, and letters of every book were translated into numerical calculations to correlate similarities and enumerate verses that reflected similarities for precise translation of the text. Copies of the Old Testament books that were found among the Dead Sea Scrolls and written before the time of Jesus Christ were compared to the Masoretic text 1000 years later. The findings were incredibly accurate and proven beyond doubt: word for word and letter for letter.

As for the New Testament scriptures, authentication of what Jesus said and did is through detailed archeological data. There are thousands of instances documenting the evidence of truth including records of eyewitnesses to events recorded. Liberal and conservative authorities completed the authentication process. Even the negative commentaries that attempt to undermine the authenticity of the Bible were refuted, and the final conclusions led to reauthentication.

As for the founder of Christianity, the Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, point to Jesus. Jesus predicted things about the future that no one could know except God himself. He lived among the people, and no one could refute his sinlessness. He was born morally perfect. Jesus is the Deity and the only incarnation of God. Sacred documents identify Jesus as the world's only Savior who died for our sins on the cross offering eternal salvation. Jesus rose from the dead as predicted. There is no one in the history of the world with such a record. Jesus stated that He was the Light of the world, the truth, and God's only Son. Jesus demonstrated power over death. He also declared that He was God. No one has been able to disprove anything that has been historically recorded about the identity of Jesus the Christ. But pervasive doctrines in our world today have convinced multitudes that God has no son.

There is a doctrine supporting the worship of millions of gods even in today's society that asserts that all physical creation is merely an illusion. This religion states that to escape the illusions of life one must go beyond consciousness and connect with a god that is the one and only real god. The doctrine teaches that the path to wholeness is through the mind of their god through altered states of consciousness and contact with spirits. This religion is older than Christianity and from it, another evolved.

The founder of the religion that evolved was a wealthy young man troubled by the suffering he noticed around him. He took on a mission to find a way to alleviate the suffering. He believed that enlightenment was the pathway to eliminating suffering. He did not consider himself a divine revelator or a deity. He was a mortal man trying to find a solution to human suffering but never found it. Also, there is another religion that is the fastest growing religion today and attracts African Americans in large numbers. It views Jesus as only a prophet. Its believers vow to destroy any nation that is a threat to its existence.

The religions that I speak of are thousands of years old and prevalent today with millions of followers. You know them by name. However, I must tell you that there is a new one that has emerged during this generation. This particular religion is more deceptive than others because it has lured babes in Christ, Christians without power or wisdom. They are Christians who are enticed by this newness of thought and interpretation of the scriptures. This contemporary religion advocates for a common religion to redeem the world of its hatred and self-destruction: a Christ consciousness.

This cosmic Christ is identified as a deity who never had a body and therefore could not have died for the sins of man. Many are waiting for signs of the end time without realizing that we have entered it, and many have fallen away.

Jesus is not a peer among other gods. He is the authority over the universe and there is none like Him. Our Lord does not need our advocacy. There is enough knowledge in the world for individuals to make an informed decision about the identity of Jesus Christ and his mission on earth. However, there is a need for intercessors for the ignorant and the foolish. We must pray for a bridge to be set before them as an exit from the doctrine of devils; a pathway to the arc of safety; deliverance from deception. There is no room to accommodate doctrines of devils and seducing spirits.

Christian Theology and Jesus are the pathways to the Father. There is indisputable evidence that Christian theology reflects truth; it is substantiated by research and authenticated by Jesus. Let us give thanks for a mind that comprehends the incomprehensible: the Word that was made flesh and dwelt among us and we beheld his glory as of the only begotten of the Father full of grace and truth (John 1:14). Hallelujah!





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
